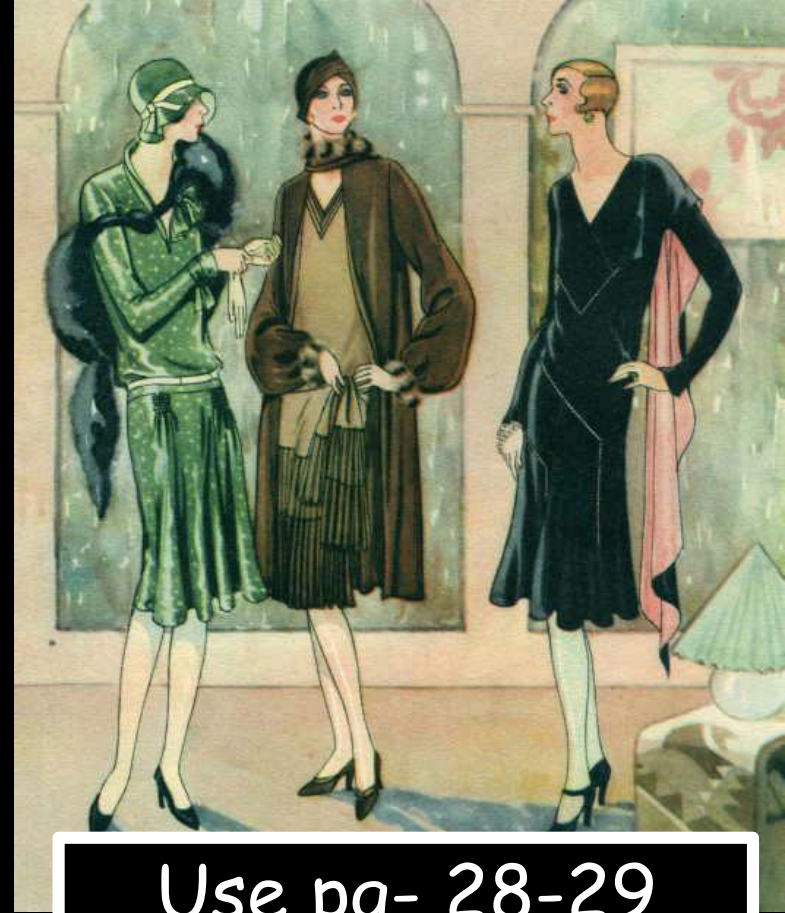
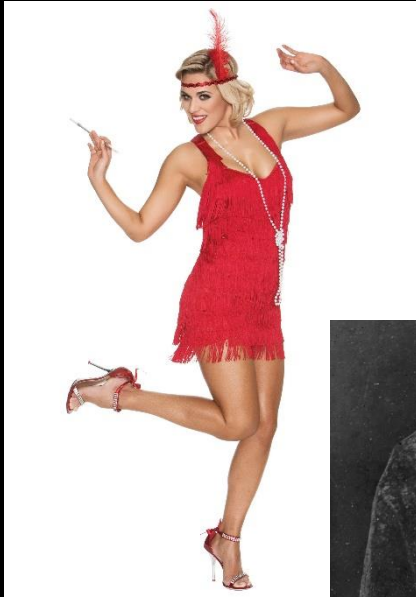
Q- Flappers were controversial figures in the 1920s.

Q- Explain how the position of women changed in the 1920s? (8 marks)

- 1920 right to vote - could become Mayors, Members of Congress, Senators.
- More jobs open - access to money and independence
- More personal freedom e.g. choice of clothes, make up etc
- Socially acceptable for women to smoke, drink, go to parties etc unaccompanied (Flappers)
- Consumer goods in the home gave housewives more free time
- Media esp. Hollywood (Gloria Swanson) portrayed this modern image -
- BUT this lifestyle of most women was not the case for most American women.

Q- Explain how the position of women changed in the 1920s? (8 marks)

Most women did not accept or adopt the flapper lifestyle

Most remained in the traditional roles of housewife and mother.

Those in work were in low pay/skill jobs.

Women were still paid less than men.

Although women could vote - there were few women politicians because it was difficult to get elected.
