

In Geography you should...

1. After each lesson

Check in Teams for any links/ messages that your teacher has posted to support the content. Go through your notes and highlight anything that you don't understand so that you can ask your teacher about this at the earliest opportunity. Read through the sheets of information your teacher has given you to make sure that you fully understand what has been discussed. Add anything extra or interesting to the notes in your exercise book and complete any outstanding work.

2. Weekly

Complete work set as homework. Read around the subject to add to your notes – watch the news for current events around the world and build up a strong topical subject knowledge.

3. Fortnightly

Read news articles to make sure you are up to date with events that are linked to your course – useful websites are:
