What does the source show/say? Remember to make use of the caption too. Link this information to your knowledge of the period - Does it match? If it doesn't then explain what you know about the topic. Give 2 developed points!</p>	<p>Example questions: Describe how restrictions were placed on immigration into the USA after 1917. Describe how Native Americans were treated by the US government during the 1920s. Describe how the lives for some black Americans did improve during the 1920s. Describe how the NAACP and UNIA attempted to improve the lives of Black Americans during the 1920s. Describe how the different groups within America society campaigned for the introduction of prohibition. Describe how Al Capone became Chicago's chief gangster. Describe the long term causes of the Wall St Crash. Describe the growth of the film industry in America between 1910 and 1929. Describe the position of women in the USA in the early 20th century.</p> <p>Tips - Paragraph 1 you should introduce the topic. Paragraph 2 you should provide specific factual detail that covers a range of key points. Paragraph 3 should provide context (what impact does the topic have)</p>	<p>Example questions: The sources and questions can be found on the following pages of the red 'The USA A Nation of Contrasts, 1910-29' book: Pages 105, 114, 119, 122, 133, 154,</p> <p>Tips - You need to explain <u>why</u> this source was produced. Use your topic knowledge when considering the content of the source. Make use of the caption/information provided, e.g. publication date or name of newspaper/book. Who was the intended audience and what does the source aim to do?</p>	<p>Example questions: The sources and questions can be found on the following pages of the red 'The USA A Nation of Contrasts, 1910-29' book: Pages: 103, 107, 109, 137, 141, 147, 156, 157</p> <p>Tips - CAAC. For each source you need to discuss <u>C</u>ontent (what the source tells us), <u>A</u>uthor (who said it and when), <u>A</u>udience (why was the source produced and who for) and <u>C</u>ontext (link the source to what is happening at the time. Paragraph 1 should follow this structure for the first source. Paragraph 2 should follow this structure for the second source. Paragraph 3 should give an overall judgement about which source is more useful.</p>	<p>Example questions: Was the growth of cinema the most important development in popular entertainment in America during this period? Were the activities of the KKK the worst examples of racial intolerance in the USA between 1910-29? Was the fear of communism the most important reason for the restrictions on immigration into the USA in the 1920s?</p> <p>Tips - Do not just discuss the factor in question. This question is the perfect chance to debate the issue! After a short introduction, your first paragraph should support the statement in the question, supported by your own knowledge. After this you should aim for at least 2-3 other factors (a paragraph per 1) and link these to the question. Finally, there needs to be a conclusion, was the key factor mentioned the most important? Or were other factors more important?</p>
