

## In FRENCH you should...

### 1. After each lesson

**Y12/Y13** - Review the work you've done in the lesson and make a note of anything that you are unsure about so that you can ask in the next lesson.

**Y12/Y13** - Revise topic-specific vocabulary using the WJEC knowledge organisers. You have these for each topic and they are also available on the WJEC website.

### 2. Weekly

**Y12** - Complete practice grammar tasks.

**Y12** - Complete practice translation tasks from French into English.

**Y13** - Complete practice translation tasks from English into French.

### 3. Fortnightly

**Y12** - Review the sections of the film we've been studying as well as your accompanying notes and worksheets.

**Y12** - Work on a specific topic using past oral cards. Prepare these for practice in class.

**Y13** - Re-read the chapters of the novel we have been studying and complete the accompanying comprehension tasks in your booklet.

**Y13** - Work on your research for your IRP. Remember to keep a log of websites, articles, etc with dates.

### 4. Termly

**Y12/Y13** - Review completed and marked film and novel essays respectively. Read the feedback, double check your grammar, make revision notes to help you prepare for timed practice questions in class.

**Y12/Y13** - Review your topic work. Use your knowledge organisers to help you.

**Y12/Y13** - Visit the Moodle course pages to check for new materials.

**Y12/Y13** - Try out/work your way through some activities on the Duolingo app.

### 5. Throughout the year

**Y12/Y13** - Complete past paper questions with mark schemes which are available on the WJEC website.
