

## IMPROVING YOUR LEARNING

Task 1:

Produce a front cover for your project that introduces your project in a creative and eye catching way! (think about using the Pop Art style of bright colours and comic book style writing).

Include the following:

•Your Name & Your Class

•Title 'Pop Art'



Task 2:



Research and collect images of the 'Pop Art' movement from

magazines, newspapers or the internet.

Create an A4 collage with the images you have collected.

Cut up the images neatly and

arrange them carefully.

Extension task: Research images and collage images of items that are popular today in your life.



Choose a piece of work by one of the artists below:

What is in the image? What kind of art is it? What is it made from?

Describe exactly what you see. What style or technique does the artist use?

Explain what you like and dislike about the work.

Extension ideas:

Add colour pictures of the artists work for extra marks!!

Add some written information in your own words about the artist himself.

## Task 4:

Create a **copy of one of the images** you have chosen to present in Task 3. Draw the image as accurately as you can on A4 paper and use appropriate materials to add colour and add detail to your work.

For extra marks write down:

The artist name

The date it was produced.



Task 5:

Create your own practical response to your chosen artist from tasks 3 & 4. This could be 2D or 3D. Discuss with your Art Teacher any ideas you have and what possible materials you could use.

Below are some suggested ideas if you are unsure:

• Andy Warhol - Choose an item from popular life today, draw it out once then repeat it by tracing it several times on a page in a grid design. Colour each section, each in different colours.

• **Roy Lichtenstein** - Select a picture of someone you admire. E.g. a sports person, politician, musician, actor or member of your family. Draw a picture of the person you have chosen in the style of Roy Lichtenstein. You may want to add a speech or thought bubble.

• Claes Oldenburg - Create a 3D model of an item of food.

• James Rosenquist - Collect a variety of images from magazines, internet, newspapers and photographs of items from your life. Cut these up and arrange in a grid like format. Some could be close up images, some further away.
