... though someone who considers themselves Jewish may not be religious.




A religious person is someone who practices a religious belief.

Being Jewish is not limited to a geographic location.




To be Jewish means to be part of the Jewish race.

So...if someone says they are Jewish they may be one by ethnicity, religion or both. Israel and Jewish Identity




Diaspora:


When many Jews were taken away from Israel and scattered across the Roman Empire.
