



Timothy McVeigh was responsible for the Oklahoma bombing, which killed 168 people. He was executed by lethal injection on June 11<sup>th</sup> 2001.

McVeigh was an ex-soldier, and had a long history of violence, if he had been sent to prison and released, many people believe he would have re-offended.



# DEATH PENALTY

"Anyone who commits murder shall be put to death." James Bulger's murderers were sent to prison for life, but were released by the time they turned 18. A crime like murder cannot be forgiven; therefore these criminals justify the death penalty.

Rules for when to use and when not to use capital punishment are spelled out clearly in the Old Testament (Exodus 21). The underlying principle is "an eye for an eye, a tooth for a tooth", which means a life for a life; no more, no less! God is seen as a fair judge who wants the punishment to fit the crime.



### Society needs to be protected from violent men!

The death Penalty acts as a deterrent to murder. Since its abolition, the number of murders and violent crimes in Britain has increased significantly.

### Protection:

Over 75% of criminals re- offend when released from prison. If a criminal is killed, society is protected from them.

### **Retribution:**

Victims deserve to have revenge on criminals because they deserve to feel better.

A Christian in favour of capital punishment must be sure that this is God's will. In deciding this, Christians are faced with conflicting advice.
